Diesel engine exhaust can kill you

If you breathe in damaging diesel engine exhaust most days at work, you could get lung or possibly bladder cancer. It's estimated that one person every three days is diagnosed with a lung cancer caused by diesel engine exhaust exposure at work. Make sure you know and use the control measures at your workplace to reduce your risk.

Don't let diesel engine exhaust be your death sentence.

Look out for signs that diesel engine exhaust may be a problem:

- Walls or surfaces are covered in soot.
- There is a smoky haze when diesel engines are used.
- There is blue or black smoke coming from diesel engine exhaust.
