## Volunteering


Cancer Council WA has an amazing team of volunteers located across the state, who assist us with all areas of our work. Volunteers can get involved in a range of local activities including:




## Supporting the Peel and Rockingham communities

## What's available at Dot's Place?

### Regional Cancer Support Coordinators

Your local Cancer Council WA Support Coordinators are health professionals who can connect you, your family members and friends to our services and other local support services available in the region.

### Transport to treatment

Through the generous support of volunteer drivers, we offer free transport to eligible local patients having radiation treatment at Fiona Stanley Hospital.

### Support groups

Support groups provide an opportunity to share your experience, and to learn and connect with others in a confidential and supportive environment. Support groups can be either a local meeting in your community, online or via phone.

### Wig Service

Located at Dot's Place, our free Wig Service includes an extensive range of wigs in the latest styles and colours. You may borrow a wig for as long as you like, and exchange it as many times as you need. A range of turbans and scarves are also available for loan.

### Complementary therapy

We offer a range of complementary therapy services to assist with well-being. Services are available to patients, carers and family members. This service is provided by volunteer complementary therapists.

### Life Now

Life Now programs can help benefit your overall emotional and physical health. The programs are led by trained facilitators, and are available to cancer

patients and their primary carer. These may include yoga, exercise and meditation. Further information can be accessed by searching 'Life Now' at [cancerwa.asn.au](http://cancerwa.asn.au).

### Financial and practical assistance

Cancer treatment can put enormous strain on your resources, and sometimes a little help can go a long way. We may be able to offer financial assistance to patients undergoing cancer treatment who meet our financial hardship criteria. Short-term practical assistance such as in-home childcare, light domestic cleaning and gardening, may be available for patients with limited support or resources and who meet our criteria.

### Legal and financial planning referral service

Cancer can change many things, including how you manage financially and how you plan to provide for your family in the future. If you need assistance with financial planning, debt consolidation, access to superannuation, planning your Will, or other legal or financial matters, we may be able to connect you to a lawyer or financial planner who may be able to assist you.

### Peer support

Cancer Connect is a telephone-based peer support program which can link you to a trained volunteer who has had a similar cancer experience to yours. There is also a free, professionally moderated online support community where people living with and affected by cancer can find, receive and provide support by participating in groups, discussions, blogs and webinars. ### Cancer counselling

You may find it helpful to talk to a professional counsellor who has experience in dealing with cancer-related issues. This service is provided for no or minimal cost, and can be accessed either face-to-face or over the phone.

### Statewide services and programs

Our 13 11 20 information and support line connects you to our Cancer Nurses. They can provide you, your family, carers or friends with confidential, accurate information and support on any cancer-related concerns you may have. Our Cancer Nurses can also inform you of statewide services and programs.

You can call 13 11 20 during business hours Monday to Friday.

If you require an interpreter please call the National Translating and Interpreting Service on 13 14 50 during business hours and request Cancer Council 13 11 20.

If you are deaf, hearing or speech impaired please call the National Relay Service on 1300 555 727 during business hours and request Cancer Council 13 11 20.
