

COMMUNITY CRITERIA CHECKLIST

- Have you completed the plain language summary of your project (Section C) and tested it on a non-medical person?
- Have you outlined your research outcomes and the extent of the benefit?
 - Have you framed the problem with the relevant epidemiological information?
 - Have you included the problem that will be addressed?
 - Have you articulated how the problem will be addressed, indicating what your methods and plan are?
 - Have you included the credibility of the team with whom you are working and the infrastructure to be utilized?
- Have you explained the translation pathway for the realization of the benefit the research will have in the patient community?
 - Have you identified the milestones and timeframes needed to reach the stated long-term benefits of this research?
 - Have you said when the short, medium and long-term outcomes will be achieved?
- Have you identified the equity component of the project?
 - Have you identified who in society will benefit from the research outcomes?
 - Have you indicated where the benefit will occur and the relevance to Western Australia?
 - Have you said why the benefit will make a difference?

Have you articulated the community/consumer involvement component of your project?

- Do you have named and trained community representativesHave you nominated how often you will be meeting your community representatives and the nature of their involvement?
- Have you referenced consumer involvement in other sections of this grant application (eg. budget, resourcing)?
