

Financial hardship and practical assistance

Cancer treatment can put enormous strain on your resources and sometimes a little help can go a long way. We offer financial assistance to patients undergoing cancer treatment who meet our financial hardship criteria. Where available, we can also provide short-term practical assistance such as in-home childcare, light domestic cleaning and gardening for eligible patients who have limited support or resources.

Legal, financial and employment support

If you need assistance with financial planning, debt consolidation, access to superannuation, planning your Will, power of attorney, or any other matters legal or financial, we may be able to connect you to a lawyer or financial planner. Eligibility criteria applies.

We also offer a Workplace Advisory Service and Small Business Advisory Service, which links patients and carers with specialist professionals, who provide advice and support on workplace and self-employment issues before and during cancer treatment.

Wellbeing after Cancer

Our Wellbeing after Cancer program offers support to people for the time after their cancer treatment has finished. This may include complete recovery from cancer, or perhaps now living with cancer.



Supporting the community

At Cancer Council Western Australia, we understand that a cancer diagnosis can have an enormous impact on anyone affected by cancer. This brochure outlines the range of practical and emotional support, professional services and information we offer to those affected by cancer living in regional areas.



Regional Cancer Support Coordinators

Our Cancer Support Coordinators are health professionals based in various regions of WA with extensive knowledge of local services and resources, who can provide:

- Accurate information to anyone affected by cancer.
- An opportunity to have a confidential discussion to ensure support can be provided that is tailored to your needs.
- Referrals to a selection of recommended professional services.

Many of our Cancer Support Coordinators are based from one of our Cancer Support Centres. Our Centres are located close by to a local cancer treatment centre and offer a selection of the services outlined in this brochure.

Where possible our Cancer Support Coordinators visit their local cancer treatment centres, to offer support and information on site. Please ask your local Cancer Support Coordinator or our 13 11 20 cancer nurses for more information.

For regional patients staying at our accommodation Lodges in Perth, a Cancer Support Coordinator is available on site during business hours on most weekdays.

Patient Assisted Travel Scheme (PATS)

Patients living in a WA Country Health Service region, who need to travel more than 100kms to access the nearest eligible medical specialist service, may qualify for a subsidy towards the cost of travel and accommodation through the Government Patient Assisted Travel Scheme (PATS). PATS assistance must be approved before you travel.

Accommodation in Perth

Our two self-catering Lodges offer a comfortable home away from home for eligible regional cancer patients and their carers, who need to travel to Perth for assessment and treatment.

Our Lodges provide a supportive environment and offer free transport to and from treatment for Lodge guests (conditions apply).

Transport to Treatment

In some regions across WA, through the generous support of volunteer drivers, we offer free transport for eligible patients to and from their cancer-related treatments or appointments.

Wig Service

Our free Wig Service includes an extensive range of wigs in the latest styles and colours. You may borrow a wig for as long as you like, and exchange it as many times as you need. A range of turbans and scarves are also available for loan.

Our Wig Service is available in Perth and some regional areas. It is run with the help of trained volunteers who assist with selection and fitting of our products. If you are unable to visit a Wig Service, products can be posted to you.

Cancer counselling

If you or someone close to you has been diagnosed with cancer, we offer a short-term face-to-face or telephone counselling service. This service is available in Perth metropolitan and regional WA through our Counselling Network.

Life Now Exercise and Meditative Courses

The Life Now program offers introductory mind and body programs, provided by experienced facilitators for cancer patients and their primary carer. Life Now is offered in Perth metropolitan and regional WA, both face-to-face and online.

Cancer Support Groups

Cancer support groups bring people together who have been affected by cancer, including partners, carers and family members, in a confidential and supportive environment. They provide a place to obtain information and to discuss ways of coping with the challenges of life after a cancer diagnosis.

Complementary therapies

Complementary therapies are supportive therapies that can be used alongside cancer treatments to improve general wellbeing and quality of life. These are provided by qualified therapists who volunteer their time and are delivered at a selection of our Cancer Support Centres.

Peer support

Cancer Connect is a telephone-based peer support program which can link you to a trained volunteer who has had a similar experience to yours.
